JOHN MOSER DIES

December 15, 1924
- October 5, 2014

John Moser, called Rockville's Renaissance man, died in early October. He was born in

Germany and immigrated to the United States in 1937 when he was 13. In 1943, John joined the US Army where he served as a paratrooper with the 101st Airborne Division.

John and his family settled in Rockville in 1953, where he began his lifelong dedication to local volunteer activities. He lost his wife Jenny in 2002. He is survived by his daughter Faith and second wife Marlene.

John had a wide and varied career with the US and Maryland Governments, became the first lobbyist for the City of Rockville in Annapolis, and was active in numerous volunteer activities. The list of organizations for which he worked is long, and encompassed civic, art, and political arenas. He greatly enjoyed the theater, reading and travelling. He served on the Rockville Cultural Commission for years.

John visited Rockville's German Sister City Pinneberg when the Sister City relationship was formed. He was a big supporter and continued member of the Rockville Sister City Corporation. RSCC will miss him.

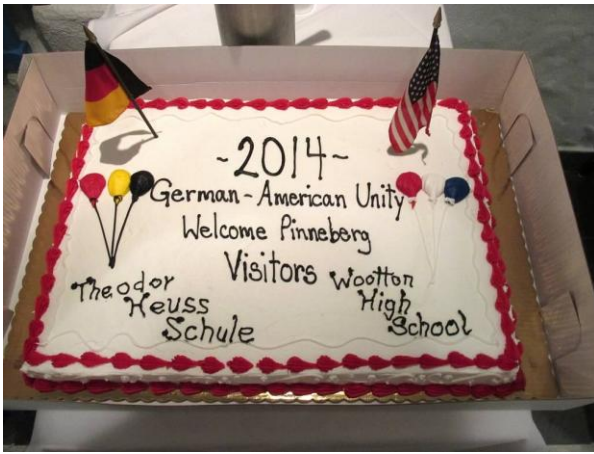
October – GERMAN-AMERICAN DAY CELEBRATION

October- ONE MONTH OF SISTER CITY HOSPITALITY

Twenty-three year-old Lisa Duhm came to the US as an intern at the German Press Agency, in order to know how journalism works in the US Capital. What she did not expect to find: a network that connects her hometown to the city of Rockville and has given her the opportunity to get to know the American way of life.

Brigitta Mullican doesn't usually ask for favors, her hands-on, do-it-yourself mindset is what keeps her going. But this time, she was serious: "Could you write this article for our website?" was one of the first things she asked when I arrived at her home in Rockville just about a month ago. It was my first



time in the US and - overwhelmed by all the new impressions and trying to return some of Brigitta's extraordinary hospitality - out came my "Yes, of course, no problem." I did not expect how time would fly by during the next four weeks.

Now, here I sit in the room that has been mine for the last month and I have just about an hour left before my bus leaves and takes me to my next destination, New York. Here I sit trying to write an article about my impressions and feelings as a young German coming to the US for the first time, but also the experiences of an aspiring journalist working with the German Press Agency (dpa) in the world's center of power, Washington, DC.

One thing is for sure: I had a great time. I worked with the largest German news wire and learned how German news is reported. I was there when we first heard about the crash of Space Ship Two and I was there when they published the preliminary results for the midterm election. I wrote a lot of short news pieces, but also some longer ones, for example the one about Muriel Bowser, DC's new mayor. I went

to press conferences with important German politicians and was allowed to cover an event with Michelle Obama at the White House. When I think about it now, it still seems crazy: I went to the White House and met Michelle Obama!

However, this is not all. Whenever I was free, I explored the US Capital. And I have to say: I got to know it, at least partly. I went to most of the museums at the National Mall, roamed through Georgetown, Eastern Market, Cleveland Park, and went to a concert at the Library of Congress. On the way, I also made new friends. Together, we celebrated Halloween, one of the most American experiences ever.

My time in DC has prepared me for the rest of my journey. I have two months ahead of me, and I want to get to know the US even better. I thank the Sister City Corporation for making my experiences here in DC and Rockville possible, and special thanks go - of course - to Brigitta, but also to George (Albrecht), Lois (Vuolo) and Liz (Von Kaenel) who gave me an even broader insight into the American hospitality!



November – FALL WINE TASTING

To celebrate the beginning of autumn, Rockville Sister City (RSCC) held a wine tasting and fund raiser at Glenview Mansion on Friday, November 7. Attendees included both RSCC members and a large group of friends, neighbors, and folks looking for a new experience. Six varieties of white table wines were served along with champagne, dessert wines, and a buffet of appetizers and dessert. An objective of the event was to present types of wine that complement each part of a meal. As always, however, the main purpose was to create a great social evening and raise funds for RSCC programs. The wine tasting was a success on all accounts. Rockville cable channel 11 recorded the affair with interviews and a video. Typically, champagne is often served before dinner to stimulate conversation and to accompany hors

d'oeuvres or appetizers such as caviar, shrimp or sushi. The latter two dishes were provided as part of the buffet along with a choice of Korbel or Chandon champagne. Both champagnes received positive reviews from guests, as did the shrimp and sushi.

Dinner entrees may be accompanied by various wine selections. White dinner wines can be sweet, tart (acidic), dry, or effervescent. They also vary with respect to alcohol content (normally 7 to 12 percent) and viscosity. While taste preferences are unique for each person, tart wine may best balance foods that contain more fat such as pork while dry, sweeter wines can enhance the delicate flavor of cheese, fish or chicken. The six dinner wines provided for tasting along with spicy chicken wings were:

Piesport Michelsberg, Germany	Kouros Rhoditis, Greece
Gewürztraminer, Germany	Bordeaux, France
Dry Riesling, California	Lugana, Italy

The most preferred choice was Piesport Michelsberg, a favorite at previous wine tastings. Some thought the Gewürztraminer was a little too sweet to accompany an entrée.

Dessert wines and digestives mark the end of a meal. Some believe these drinks, which often are sweet and contain significantly more alcohol (15 to 25 percent alcohol), may improve digestion. Also, it is assumed that consumption with a full stomach can limit the impact of higher alcohol content. Two dessert wines were served - Moscato (California) and Pear Port (Virginia), along with choices of pastries, cake, and cookies. The Pear Port, a fortified wine produced by Horton Vineyard, was the big hit of the evening. This white port was enthusiastically endorsed by guests and its supply was quickly consumed.

November – CHINA VISAS

Thanks to a bilateral government agreement extended visas have been created. Under the arrangement, tourists and business people will get

multiple entry visas valid for 10 years while students will get multiple entry visas for five years. Before the agreement, the visas were valid for 12 months only. [*China Daily*, Nov 13, 2014]

December - JIAXING DELEGATES VISIT ROCKVILLE

A Jiaxing delegation will be in Rockville for a few days in December. Their mission is to: 1) meet with the City of Rockville Mayor and Council; 2) hold discussions with educational contacts; 3) visit schools in Rockville and explore the possibilities of establishing sister school relations between our two cities; and 4) learn the experiences in fields of administrative supervision and the utilization of public funds.
